1)	W	hat does it mean to be a disciple of Jesus?
	A)	Being a disciple of Jesus means to Him alone.
		(1) Jesus faithfully preached the gospel of the Kingdom of God, and He eagerly  all who believed. However, when large began to follow Him, He turned to them and urged them to consider what they were doing:
		(a) "And calling the crowd to him with his disciples, he said to them, 'If anyone would come after me, let him himself and take up his and me. For whoever would save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake and the gospel's will save it" (Mark 8:34–35).
		(b) "Now great crowds accompanied him, and he turned and said to them, 'If anyone comes to me and does not his own father and mother and wife and children and brothers and sisters, yes, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple. Whoever does not bear his own and come after me cannot be my disciple. So therefore, any one of you who does not all that he has cannot be my disciple" (Luke 14:25–27, 33).
		(2) This shows us that being Jesus' disciple is from being someone else's disciple. Being a disciple of Christ involves:
		(a) A Are we willing to love God more than anyone else?

		(d)	"For you yourselves know how you ought to us, because we were not idle when we were with you, nor did we eat anyone's bread without paying for it, but with toil and labor we worked night and day, that we might not be a burden to any of you. 		(e)	"You know what kind of men we proved to be among you for your sake. And you became of us and of the Lord, for you received the word in much affliction, with the joy of the Holy Spirit, so that you became an to all the believers in Macedonia and in Achaia" (1 Thess 1:5b-7).		
		(f)	"And we desire each one of you to show the same earnestness to have the full assurance of hope until the end, so that you may not be sluggish, but of those who through faith and patience inherit the promises" (Heb 6:12).		
		(g)	"Remember your leaders, those who spoke to you the word of God. Consider the outcome of their way of life, and their faith" (Heb 13:7).

	(3) "I have become things to all people, that by all means I might some" (1 Cor 9:22b).
F)	In conclusion, being a disciple of Jesus means we must:
	(1) We must die to ourselves, dedicate ourselves to Christ, and live committed to Him each day.
	(2) We must cultivate a relationship with God, learn all we can of His Word (Jesus <u>is</u> the Word), and obey what He commands.
	(3) We must imitate the example of Christ, and we should follow the example of other godly men and women.
