	• If possible, hold training sessions. Depending on the number of individuals, it may not be possible to train the core all at once. Start with one or two men and build from there.					
	• Start with discipleship and make sure they're firmly in what it means to be a disciple of Jesus. The website provides all the material needed for teaching the basics of personal discipleship.					
	• Once they're established in personal discipleship, begin modeling discipleship. The "Disciple-Making Family" lesson explains how to do this, and this approach can be followed for the weekly training sessions.					
	• After a while, have them try one of the sessions. This will give them practice in family discipleship and also prepare them to show others how it's done.
