Matthew 12:15–21	Mark 3:7–12
<p>15 But Jesus, aware of <i>this</i>, withdrew from there. Mark 3:13–19	Luke 6:12–16
<p>13 And He went up on the mountain</p> <p>and summoned those whom He Himself wanted, and they came to Him.</p> <p>14 And He appointed twelve,</p> <p>so that they would be with Him and that He <i>could</i> send them out to preach,</p> <p>15 and to have authority to cast out the demons.</p> <p>16 And He appointed the twelve:</p>	<p>12 It was at this time that He went off to the mountain to pray, and He spent the whole night in prayer to God.</p> <p>13 And when day came, He called His disciples to Him</p> <p>and chose twelve of them, whom He also named as apostles:</p>

<p>Simon (to whom He gave the name Peter), 17 and James, the <i>son</i> of Zebedee, and John the brother of James (to them He gave the name Boanerges, which means, “Sons of Thunder”); 18 and Andrew, and Philip, and Bartholomew, and Matthew, and Thomas, and James the son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus, and Simon the Zealot; 19 and Judas Iscariot, who betrayed Him.</p>	<p>14a Simon, whom He also named Peter, 14c and James and John; 14b and Andrew his brother; 14d and Philip and Bartholomew; 15a and Matthew and Thomas; James <i>the son</i> of Alphaeus, 16a Judas <i>the son</i> of James, 15b and Simon who was called the Zealot; 16b and Judas Iscariot, who became a traitor.</p>
