<p>3b “Behold, the sower went out to sow; 4 and as he sowed, some <i>seeds</i> fell beside the road, and the birds came and ate them up. 5 Others fell on the rocky places, where they did not have much soil; and immediately they sprang up, because they had no depth of soil. 6 But when the sun had risen, they were scorched; and because they had no root, they withered away. 7 Others fell among the thorns, and the thorns came up and choked them out. 8 And others fell on the good soil and yielded a crop, some a hundredfold, some sixty, and some thirty. 9 “He who has ears, let him hear.”</p>	<p>3 “Listen <i>to this!</i> Behold, the sower went out to sow; 4 as he was sowing, some <i>seed</i> fell beside the road, and the birds came and ate it up. 5 Other <i>seed</i> fell on the rocky <i>ground</i> where it did not have much soil; and immediately it sprang up because it had no depth of soil. 6 And after the sun had risen, it was scorched; and because it had no root, it withered away. 7 Other <i>seed</i> fell among the thorns, and the thorns came up and choked it, and it yielded no crop. 8 Other <i>seeds</i> fell into the good soil, and as they grew up and increased, they yielded a crop and produced thirty, sixty, and a hundredfold.” 9 And He was saying, “He who has ears to hear, let him hear.”</p>	<p>5 “The sower went out to sow his seed; and as he sowed, some fell beside the road, and it was trampled under foot and the birds of the air ate it up. 6 Other <i>seed</i> fell on rocky <i>soil</i>, and as soon as it grew up, it withered away, because it had no moisture. 7 Other <i>seed</i> fell among the thorns; and the thorns grew up with it and choked it out. 8 Other <i>seed</i> fell into the good soil, and grew up, and produced a crop a hundred times as great.” As He said these things, He would call out, “He who has ears to hear, let him hear.”</p>
