Matthew 9:18–26	Mark 5:21–43	Luke 8:40–56
<p>18 While He was saying these things to them, a <i>synagogue</i> official came</p> <p>and bowed down before Him,</p> <p>and said, “My daughter</p> <p>has just died; but come and lay Your hand on her, and she will live.”</p> <p>19 Jesus got up and <i>began</i> to follow him, and <i>so did</i> His disciples.</p> <p>20 And a woman who had been suffering from a hemorrhage for twelve years,</p> <p>came up behind Him and touched the fringe of His cloak; 21 for she was saying to herself, “If I only touch His garment, I will get well.”</p>	<p>21 When Jesus had crossed over again in the boat to the other side, a large crowd gathered around Him; and so He stayed by the seashore.</p> <p>22 One of the synagogue officials named Jairus came up, and on seeing Him, fell at His feet 23 and implored Him earnestly, saying, “My little daughter is at the point of death; <i>please</i> come and lay Your hands on her, so that she will get well and live.”</p> <p>24 And He went off with him; and a large crowd was following Him and pressing in on Him.</p> <p>25 A woman who had had a hemorrhage for twelve years, 26 and had endured much at the hands of many physicians, and had spent all that she had and was not helped at all, but rather had grown worse— 27 after hearing about Jesus, she came up in the crowd behind <i>Him</i> and touched His cloak. 28 For she thought, “If I just touch His garments, I will get well.” 29 Immediately the flow of her blood was dried up; and she felt in her body that she was healed of her affliction.</p>	<p>40 And as Jesus returned, the people welcomed Him, for they had all been waiting for Him.</p> <p>41 And there came a man named Jairus, and he was an official of the synagogue; and he fell at Jesus’ feet, and <i>began</i> to implore Him to come to his house; 42 for he had an only daughter, about twelve years old, and she was dying.</p> <p>But as He went, the crowds were pressing against Him. 43 And a woman who had a hemorrhage for twelve years, and could not be healed by anyone, 44 came up behind Him and touched the fringe of His cloak, and immediately her hemorrhage stopped.</p>

<p>22 But Jesus</p> <p>turning</p> <p>and seeing her said, “Daughter, take courage; your faith has made you well.”</p> <p>At once the woman was made well.</p>	<p>30 Immediately Jesus, perceiving in Himself that the power <i>proceeding</i> from Him had gone forth, turned around in the crowd and said, “Who touched My garments?”</p> <p>31 And His disciples said to Him, “You see the crowd pressing in on You, and You say, ‘Who touched Me?’”</p> <p>32 And He looked around to see the woman who had done this.</p> <p>33 But the woman fearing and trembling, aware of what had happened to her, came and fell down before Him and told Him the whole truth.</p> <p>34 And He said to her, “Daughter, your faith has made you well; go in peace and be healed of your affliction.”</p>	<p>45 And Jesus said, “Who is the one who touched Me?”</p> <p>And while they were all denying it, Peter said, “Master, the people are crowding and pressing in on You.”</p> <p>46 But Jesus said, “Someone did touch Me, for I was aware that power had gone out of Me.”</p> <p>47 When the woman saw that she had not escaped notice, she came trembling and fell down before Him, and declared in the presence of all the people the reason why she had touched Him, and how she had been immediately healed.</p> <p>48 And He said to her, “Daughter, your faith has made you well; go in peace.”</p>
