Matthew 13:54–58	Mark 6:1–6a
<p>54 He came to His hometown</p> <p>and <i>began</i> teaching them in their synagogue, so that they were astonished, and said, “Where <i>did</i> this man <i>get</i> this wisdom and <i>these</i> miraculous powers?</p> <p>55 Is not this the carpenter’s son? Is not His mother called Mary, and His brothers, James and Joseph and Simon and Judas?</p> <p>56 And His sisters, are they not all with us? Where then <i>did</i> this man <i>get</i> all these things?”</p> <p>57 And they took offense at Him. But Jesus said to them, “A prophet is not without honor except in his hometown and in his <i>own</i> household.”</p> <p>58 And He did not do many miracles there</p> <p>because of their unbelief.</p>	<p>1 Jesus went out from there and came into His hometown; and His disciples followed Him.</p> <p>2 When the Sabbath came, He began to teach in the synagogue; and the many listeners were astonished, saying, “Where did this man <i>get</i> these things, and what is <i>this</i> wisdom given to Him, and such miracles as these performed by His hands?</p> <p>3 Is not this the carpenter, the son of Mary, and brother of James and Joses and Judas and Simon? Are not His sisters here with us?”</p> <p>And they took offense at Him.</p> <p>4 Jesus said to them, “A prophet is not without honor except in his hometown and among his <i>own</i> relatives and in his <i>own</i> household.”</p> <p>5 And He could do no miracle there except that He laid His hands on a few sick people and healed them.</p> <p>6a And He wondered at their unbelief.</p>
