

Galilean Ministry—Commissioning of the Twelve: Part 1 (Winter 31/32)

Matthew 9:35–10:15	Mark 6:6b–11	Luke 9:1–5
<p>9:35 Jesus was going through all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the gospel of the kingdom, and healing every kind of disease and every kind of sickness.</p> <p>36 Seeing the people, He felt compassion for them, because they were distressed and dispirited like sheep without a shepherd.</p> <p>37 Then He said to His disciples, “The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few.</p> <p>38 Therefore beseech the Lord of the harvest to send out workers into His harvest.”</p> <p>10:1 Jesus summoned His twelve disciples and</p> <p>gave them authority over unclean spirits, to cast them out, and to heal every kind of disease and every kind of sickness.</p> <p>2 Now the names of the twelve apostles are these: The first, Simon, who is called Peter, and Andrew his brother; and James the son of Zebedee, and John his brother;</p> <p>3 Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James the son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus;</p> <p>4 Simon the Zealot, and Judas Iscariot, the one who betrayed Him.</p> <p>5 These twelve Jesus sent out after instructing them: “Do not go in <i>the way of the</i> Gentiles, and do not enter</p>	<p>6b And He was going around the villages teaching.</p> <p>7 And He summoned the twelve and began to send them out in pairs, and gave them authority over the unclean spirits;</p> <p>8 and He instructed them that they should</p>	<p>1 And He called the twelve together, and</p> <p>gave them power and authority over all the demons</p> <p>and to heal diseases.</p> <p>2 And He sent them out to proclaim the kingdom of God and to perform healing.</p> <p>3 And He said to them,</p>

<p>any city of the Samaritans; 6 but rather go to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. 7 And as you go, preach, saying, 'The kingdom of heaven is at hand.' 8 Heal <i>the</i> sick, raise <i>the</i> dead, cleanse <i>the</i> lepers, cast out demons. Freely you received, freely give.</p> <p>9 Do not acquire gold, or silver, or copper for your money belts, 10 or a bag for <i>your</i> journey, or even two coats, or sandals, or a staff; for the worker is worthy of his support.</p> <p>11 And whatever city or village you enter, inquire who is worthy in it, and stay at his house until you leave <i>that</i> city. 12 As you enter the house, give it your greeting. 13 If the house is worthy, give it your <i>blessing of peace</i>. But if it is not worthy, take back your <i>blessing of peace</i>. 14 Whoever does not receive you, nor heed your words, as you go out of that house or that city, shake the dust off your feet.</p> <p>15 Truly I say to you, it will be more tolerable for <i>the</i> land of Sodom and Gomorrah in the day of judgment than for that city.</p>	<p>take nothing for <i>their</i> journey, except a mere staff—no bread, no bag, no money in their belt— 9 but <i>to</i> wear sandals; and <i>He added</i>, "Do not put on two tunics."</p> <p>10 And He said to them, "Wherever you enter a house, stay there until you leave town.</p> <p>11 "Any place that does not receive you or listen to you, as you go out from there, shake the dust off the soles of your feet for a testimony against them."</p>	<p>"Take nothing for <i>your</i> journey, neither a staff, nor a bag, nor bread, nor money; and do not <i>even</i> have two tunics apiece.</p> <p>4 "Whatever house you enter, stay there until you leave that city.</p> <p>5 "And as for those who do not receive you, as you go out from that city, shake the dust off your feet as a testimony against them."</p>
