- 5 O God, you yourself know my foolishness, and my guilty deeds are not hidden from you.

- 12 Those sitting at *the* gate talk about me *as* also *the* songs of *the* drunkards.
- But as for me, my prayer *is* to you, O Yahweh, for a favorable time,
   O God, according to the abundance of your loyal love.
   Answer me with the faithfulness of your salvation.
- 14 Deliver me from *the* mud and do not let me sink. Let me be delivered from *those who* hate me and from *the* watery depths.

- 24 Pour out your indignation on them, and let your burning anger overtake them.
- 25 Let their camp be desolate. Let none dwell in their tents, [Acts 1:20]
- 26 because they persecute *those* whom you, yourself, have struck, and they tell of the pain of *those* you have wounded.
- 27 Add guilt on top of their guilt, and do not let them be acquitted.
- 28 Let them be blotted out of *the* book of *the* living, and let them not be recorded with *the* righteous.
- 29 But as for me, *though* I *am* afflicted and pained, your salvation will protect me, O God.
- 30 I will praise the name of God in song, and magnify him with thanksgiving.
- 31 For Yahweh it will be better than an ox *or* bull, horned *and* hoofed.
- 32 *The* afflicted will see *and* rejoice. O God seekers, let your heart revive,
