Tell the Coming Generation (c. David/Solomon)

Psalm 78

A maskil of Asaph.

- Listen, O my people, to my teaching.
 Incline your ears to the words of my mouth.
- 2 I will offer a parable with my mouth.
 I will pour out riddles from long ago, [Matt 13:35]
- 3 that we have heard and known, and our ancestors have told us.
- 4 We will not hide *them* from their children, telling the next generation the praises of Yahweh, and his power and his wonders that he has done.
- For he established a testimony in Jacob, and appointed a law in Israel, which he commanded our ancestors to teach to their children, [Deut 4:9–10; 6:7, 20–25]
- 6 so that the next generation might know children yet to be born that they might rise up and tell their children,
- 7 that they might set their confidence in God, and not forget the deeds of God, but keep his commandments,
- 8 and not be like their ancestors, a stubborn and rebellious generation, a generation that did not make ready its heart, whose spirit was not faithful to God.
- 9 The sons of Ephraim, armed with archers, turned back on *the* day of battle.
- 10 They did not keep the covenant of God and refused to go in his law.
- 11 They also forgot his deeds, and his wonders that he had shown them.
- 12 In front of their ancestors he did a wonder, in the land of Egypt, *in* the region of Zoan.
- 13 He split the sea and caused them to go over, and he caused waters to stand like a heap.
- And he led them with the cloud by day, and all night with a fiery light.
- 15 He caused rocks to split in the wilderness and provided drink abundantly as *from the* depths.
- 16 And he brought streams out of *the* rock and caused water to flow down like rivers.
- 17 But they sinned still further against him by rebelling *against the* Most High in the desert.
- 18 And they tested God in their heart by asking food for their craving.
- 19 And they spoke against God. They said, "Is God able to prepare a table in the wilderness?
- 20 Yes, he struck *the* rock and water flowed and streams gushed out, but can he also give food or provide meat for his people?"
- Therefore Yahweh heard and he was very angry, and a fire was kindled against Jacob, and his anger also rose up against Israel,
 because they did not believe God,

- and they did not trust his salvation.
- 23 Nevertheless, he commanded *the* skies above and opened *the* doors of heaven,
- and rained down on them manna to eat and gave them the grain of heaven.
- Humankind ate the bread of angels.He sent them food enough to be satisfied.
- He caused *the* east wind to blow in the heavens and drove along *the* south wind by his strength.
- 27 Then he rained meat on them like dust, even winged birds like *the* sand of *the* seas.
- He caused *them* to fall in the midst of his camp, all around his dwellings.
- 29 So they ate and were well filled, and he brought about *what* they craved.
- 30 They had not yet turned aside from their craving, while their food was still in their mouth,
- 31 the anger of God rose against them, and he killed some of the stoutest of them, even the young men of Israel he caused to bow down *in death*.
- 32 In spite of all this they sinned further and did not believe his wonders.
- 33 And he consumed their days with futility their years with terror.
- When he killed *some of* them, then they sought him, and repented and earnestly sought God.
- 35 And they remembered that God *was* their rock, and God Most High their redeemer.
- 36 But they enticed him with their mouth and lied to him with their tongue.
- 37 For their heart was not steadfast with him, nor were they faithful to his covenant.
- 38 But he was compassionate; he pardoned their guilt and did not destroy them.
 And many times he turned back his anger and did not stir up all his wrath,
- 39 for he remembered that they *were* flesh, a passing wind that does not return.
- 40 How often they rebelled against him in the wilderness and vexed him in *the* wasteland!
- 41 So they again tested God and distressed the Holy One of Israel.
- 42 And they did not remember his power when he redeemed them from the enemy,
- 43 how he performed his signs in Egypt and his wonders in the region of Zoan,
- when he turned their rivers to blood so they could not drink *from* their streams.
- 45 He sent among them flies that devoured them and frogs that destroyed them.
- 46 And he gave their crop to the locusts and their labor to the locust.
- 47 He destroyed their vines with hail and their sycamore trees with sleet.
- 48 He also handed their cattle over to the hail and their livestock to the lightning bolts.
- 49 He sent against them his fierce anger, rage and indignation and trouble,

a band of destroying angels.

50 He cleared a path for his anger.

He did not spare them from death

but handed their life over to the plague.

- 51 And he struck down all *the* firstborn in Egypt, *the* first of *their* virility in the tents of Ham.
- 52 Then he led out his people like sheep and guided them like a herd in the wilderness.
- 53 And he led them safely and they were not afraid, but the sea covered their enemies.
- So he brought them to his holy territory, this mountain his right hand acquired.
- And he drove out nations before them and allocated them for an inheritance by *boundary* line, and settled the tribes of Israel in their tents.
- 56 But they tested and rebelled against God Most High and did not keep his statutes.
- 57 And they turned and were treacherous like their ancestors. They twisted like a crooked bow.
- For they provoked him to anger with their high places, and made him jealous with their images.
- 59 God heard and he was very angry and rejected Israel utterly.
- 60 So he abandoned the dwelling place at Shiloh, *the* tent he had placed among humankind.
- And he gave his strength into captivity and his splendor into *the* hand of *the* enemy.
- He also handed his people over to the sword, and he was very angry with his inheritance.
- 63 Fire devoured his young men, and his young women were not praised.
- 64 His priests fell by the sword, and his widows did not weep.
- Then the Lord awoke like *one who had been* asleep, *awoke* like a warrior who had been drunk with wine.
- And he beat back his enemies; he gave them over to perpetual scorn.
- 67 And he rejected the tent of Joseph, and did not chose the tribe of Ephraim,
- 68 but chose the tribe of Judah, Mount Zion that he loved.
- 69 And he built his sanctuary like *the* heights, like *the* earth that he established forever.
- 70 And he chose David his servant and took him from *the* sheepfolds.
- 71 He brought him from following nursing ewes to shepherd Jacob, his people, and Israel, his inheritance.
- And he shepherded them according to the integrity of his heart, and led them by the skillfulness of his hands.

Oh, That My People Would Listen to Me (c. David/Solomon)

Psalm 81

For the music director; on the Gittith.

Of Asaph.

Shout out to God our strength; shout joyfully to the God of Jacob.

- 2 Lift up a song and strike *the* tambourine, *the* pleasant lyre, together with *the* harp.
- 3 Blow *the* horn at new moon, at full moon, for our feast day,
- 4 because it *is* a statute for Israel, an ordinance of the God of Jacob.
- 5 He made it a statute in Joseph when he went out against the land of Egypt, where I heard a language I did not know.
- 6 "I removed his shoulder from a burden. His hands were freed from *the* basket.
- 7 In this trouble you called, and I rescued you.
 Within *the* secret place of thunder I answered you;
 I tested you at the waters of Meribah. *Selah*
- 8 Hear, O my people, and I will admonish you; O Israel, if you would *but* listen to me.
- 9 There shall be no strange god among you, and you shall not bow down to a foreign god.
- 10 I am Yahweh your God, who brought you up from the land of Egypt.Open wide your mouth and I will fill it.
- 11 But my people did not listen to my voice, and Israel did not yield to me.
- 12 So I let them go in the stubbornness of their heart; they walked in their counsels.
- 13 Oh that my people would listen to me; that Israel would walk in my ways.
- 14 I would subdue their enemies quickly, and turn my hand against their adversaries.
- 15 Those who hate Yahweh would cringe before him, and their fate would be forever.
- 16 But he would feed him from *the* choicest wheat, and I would satisfy you with honey from a rock."

Rescue the Weak and Needy (c. David/Solomon)

Psalm 82

A psalm of Asaph.

- God stands in the divine assembly; he administers judgment in the midst of *the* gods.
- 2 "How long will you judge unjustly and show favoritism to the wicked? *Selah*
- 3 Judge *on behalf of the* helpless and *the* orphan; provide justice *to the* afflicted and *the* poor.
- 4 Rescue *the* helpless and *the* needy; deliver *them* from the hand of *the* wicked."
- 5 They do not know or consider.
 They go about in the darkness,
 so that all the foundations of the earth are shaken.
- 6 I have said, "You are gods, [John 10:34] and sons of the Most High, all of you.
- 7 However, you will die like men, and you will fall like one of the princes."
- 8 Rise up, O God, judge the earth, because you shall inherit all the nations.

O God, Do Not Keep Silent (c. David/Solomon)

Psalm 83

A song. A psalm of Asaph.

- O God, do not rest silently.
 Do not keep silent or be still, O God.
- 2 For look, your enemies roar, and those who hate you have lifted *their* head.
- 3 They devise cunning schemes against your people, and consult together against your protected ones.
- 4 They say, "Come, let us annihilate them from *being* a nation, so that the name of Israel will be remembered no more."
- 5 For they have consulted together with a unified purpose. They have made a covenant against you:
- 6 the tents of Edom and *the* Ishmaelites, Moab and *the* Hagrites,
- 7 Gebal and Ammon and Amalek, Philistia, with the inhabitants of Tyre.
- 8 Assyria also has joined with them.

 They provide help to the children of Lot. *Selah*
- 9 Do to them as *you did with* Midian, as *with* Sisera, as *with* Jabin at the wadi of Kishon.
- 10 They were destroyed at En-dor; they became dung for the ground.
- 11 Make their leaders like Oreb and Zeeb, and all their chiefs like Zebah and Zalmunna,
- who said, "Let us take *as* our possession the pastures of God."
- 13 O my God, make them like the tumbleweed, like the chaff before wind.
- As fire burns a forest, and as a flame sets afire mountains,
- so pursue them with your tempest and terrify them with your storm.
- 16 Fill their faces with shame, that they may seek your name, O Yahweh.
- 17 Let them be ashamed and terrified forever, and let them be humiliated and perish
- that they may know that you, whose name is Yahweh, you alone, are the Most High over the whole earth.
