

I Will Walk with Integrity (c. 1022 – c. 969t BC)

Psalm 101

A Psalm of David.

- 1 I will sing of lovingkindness and justice,
To You, O LORD, I will sing praises.
- 2 I will give heed to the blameless way.
When will You come to me?
I will walk within my house in the integrity of my heart.
- 3 I will set no worthless thing before my eyes;
I hate the work of those who fall away;
It shall not fasten its grip on me.
- 4 A perverse heart shall depart from me;
I will know no evil.
- 5 Whoever secretly slanders his neighbor, him I will destroy;
No one who has a haughty look and an arrogant heart will I endure.
- 6 My eyes shall be upon the faithful of the land, that they may dwell with me;
He who walks in a blameless way is the one who will minister to me.
- 7 He who practices deceit shall not dwell within my house;
He who speaks falsehood shall not maintain his position before me.
- 8 Every morning I will destroy all the wicked of the land,
So as to cut off from the city of the LORD all those who do iniquity.

Bless the LORD, O My Soul (c. 1022 – c. 969t BC)

Psalm 103

A Psalm of David.

- 1 Bless the LORD, O my soul,
And all that is within me, *bless* His holy name.
- 2 Bless the LORD, O my soul,
And forget none of His benefits;
- 3 Who pardons all your iniquities,
Who heals all your diseases;
- 4 Who redeems your life from the pit,
Who crowns you with lovingkindness and compassion;
- 5 Who satisfies your years with good things,
So that your youth is renewed like the eagle.
- 6 The LORD performs righteous deeds
And judgments for all who are oppressed.
- 7 He made known His ways to Moses,
His acts to the sons of Israel.
- 8 The LORD is compassionate and gracious,
Slow to anger and abounding in lovingkindness.
- 9 He will not always strive *with us*,
Nor will He keep *His anger* forever.
- 10 He has not dealt with us according to our sins,
Nor rewarded us according to our iniquities.
- 11 For as high as the heavens are above the earth,
So great is His lovingkindness toward those who fear Him.
- 12 As far as the east is from the west,
So far has He removed our transgressions from us.
- 13 Just as a father has compassion on *his* children,
So the LORD has compassion on those who fear Him.
- 14 For He Himself knows our frame;
He is mindful that we are *but* dust.
- 15 As for man, his days are like grass;
As a flower of the field, so he flourishes.
- 16 When the wind has passed over it, it is no more,
And its place acknowledges it no longer.

- 17 But the lovingkindness of the LORD is from everlasting to everlasting on those who fear Him,
And His righteousness to children's children,
18 To those who keep His covenant
And remember His precepts to do them.
19 The LORD has established His throne in the heavens,
And His sovereignty rules over all.
20 Bless the LORD, you His angels,
Mighty in strength, who perform His word,
Obeying the voice of His word!
21 Bless the LORD, all you His hosts,
You who serve Him, doing His will.
22 Bless the LORD, all you works of His,
In all places of His dominion;
Bless the LORD, O my soul!

Help Me, O Lord My God [Messianic] (c. 1022 – c. 969t bc)

Psalm 109

For the choir director.

A Psalm of David.

- 1 O God of my praise,
Do not be silent!
2 For they have opened the wicked and deceitful mouth against me;

They have spoken against me with a lying tongue.
3 They have also surrounded me with words of hatred,
And fought against me without cause.
4 In return for my love they act as my accusers;
But I am *in* prayer.
5 Thus they have repaid me evil for good
And hatred for my love.
6 Appoint a wicked man over him,
And let an accuser stand at his right hand.
7 When he is judged, let him come forth guilty,
And let his prayer become sin.
8 Let his days be few;
Let another take his office. [[Acts 1:20](#)]
9 Let his children be fatherless
And his wife a widow.
10 Let his children wander about and beg;
And let them seek *sustenance* far from their ruined homes.
11 Let the creditor seize all that he has,
And let strangers plunder the product of his labor.
12 Let there be none to extend lovingkindness to him,
Nor any to be gracious to his fatherless children.
13 Let his posterity be cut off;
In a following generation let their name be blotted out.
14 Let the iniquity of his fathers be remembered before the LORD,
And do not let the sin of his mother be blotted out.
15 Let them be before the LORD continually,
That He may cut off their memory from the earth;
16 Because he did not remember to show lovingkindness,
But persecuted the afflicted and needy man,
And the despondent in heart, to put *them* to death.
17 He also loved cursing, so it came to him;
And he did not delight in blessing, so it was far from him.
18 But he clothed himself with cursing as with his garment,
And it entered into his body like water
And like oil into his bones.
19 Let it be to him as a garment with which he covers himself,
And for a belt with which he constantly girds himself.
20 Let this be the reward of my accusers from the LORD,
And of those who speak evil against my soul.
21 But You, O GOD, the Lord, deal *kindly* with me for Your name's sake;
Because Your lovingkindness is good, deliver me;
22 For I am afflicted and needy,
And my heart is wounded within me.
23 I am passing like a shadow when it lengthens;
I am shaken off like the locust.
24 My knees are weak from fasting,
And my flesh has grown lean, without fatness.
25 I also have become a reproach to them;
When they see me, they wag their head. [[Matt 27:39](#)]
26 Help me, O LORD my God;
Save me according to Your lovingkindness.
27 And let them know that this is Your hand;
You, LORD, have done it.
28 Let them curse, but You bless;
When they arise, they shall be ashamed,
But Your servant shall be glad.
29 Let my accusers be clothed with dishonor,
And let them cover themselves with their own shame as with a robe.

- 30 With my mouth I will give thanks abundantly to the LORD;
And in the midst of many I will praise Him.
- 31 For He stands at the right hand of the needy,
To save him from those who judge his soul.

Sit at My Right Hand [Messianic] (c. 1022 – c. 969t BC)

Psalm 110

A Psalm of David.

- 1 The LORD says to my Lord:
“Sit at My right hand
Until I make Your enemies a footstool for Your feet.” [[Matt 22:41–46](#); [Heb 1:13](#)]
- 2 The LORD will stretch forth Your strong scepter from Zion, *saying*,
“Rule in the midst of Your enemies.”
- 3 Your people will volunteer freely in the day of Your power;
In holy array, from the womb of the dawn,
Your youth are to You *as* the dew.
- 4 The LORD has sworn and will not change His mind,
“You are a priest forever
According to the order of Melchizedek.” [[Heb 5:6](#); [6:20](#); [7:17, 21](#)]
- 5 The Lord is at Your right hand;
He will shatter kings in the day of His wrath.
- 6 He will judge among the nations,
He will fill *them* with corpses,
He will shatter the chief men over a broad country.
- 7 He will drink from the brook by the wayside;
Therefore He will lift up *His* head.
