Matthew 8:14–17	Mark 1:29–34	Luke 4:38–41
<p>14 When Jesus came into Peter's home, He saw his mother-in-law lying sick in bed with a fever.</p> <p>15 He touched her hand, and the fever left her; and she got up and waited on Him.</p> <p>16 When evening came, they brought to Him many who were demon-possessed; and He cast out the spirits with a word, and healed all who were ill.</p> <p>17 <i>This was to fulfill what was spoken through Isaiah the prophet: "HE HIMSELF TOOK OUR INFIRMITIES AND CARRIED AWAY OUR DISEASES."</i> [Isa 53:4]</p>	<p>29 And immediately after they came out of the synagogue, they came into the house of Simon and Andrew, with James and John.</p> <p>30 Now Simon's mother-in-law was lying sick with a fever; and immediately they spoke to Jesus about her.</p> <p>31 And He came to her and raised her up, taking her by the hand, and the fever left her, and she waited on them.</p> <p>32 When evening came, after the sun had set, they <i>began</i> bringing to Him all who were ill and those who were demon-possessed.</p> <p>33 And the whole city had gathered at the door.</p> <p>34 And He healed many who were ill with various diseases, and cast out many demons;</p> <p>and He was not permitting the demons to speak, because they knew who He was.</p>	<p>38 Then He got up and <i>left</i> the synagogue, and entered Simon's home.</p> <p>Now Simon's mother-in-law was suffering from a high fever, and they asked Him to help her.</p> <p>39 And standing over her, He rebuked the fever, and it left her; and she immediately got up and waited on them.</p> <p>40 While the sun was setting, all those who had any <i>who were</i> sick with various diseases brought them to Him; and laying His hands on each one of them, He was healing them.</p> <p>41 Demons also were coming out of many, shouting, "You are the Son of God!" Matthew 8:2–4	Mark 1:40–45	Luke 5:12–16
<p>2 And a leper came to Him and bowed down before Him, and said, “Lord, if You are willing, You can make me clean.”</p> <p>3 Jesus stretched out His hand and touched him, saying, “I am willing; be cleansed.” And immediately his leprosy was cleansed.</p> <p>4 And Jesus said to him, “See that you tell no one; but go, show yourself to the priest and present the offering that Moses commanded, as a testimony to them.”</p>	<p>40 And a leper came to Jesus, beseeching Him and falling on his knees before Him, and saying, “If You are willing, You can make me clean.”</p> <p>41 Moved with compassion, Jesus stretched out His hand and touched him, and said to him, “I am willing; be cleansed.”</p> <p>42 Immediately the leprosy left him and he was cleansed.</p> <p>43 And He sternly warned him and immediately sent him away,</p> <p>44 and He said to him, “See that you say nothing to anyone; but go, show yourself to the priest and offer for your cleansing what Moses commanded, as a testimony to them.”</p> <p>45 But he went out and began to proclaim it freely and to spread the news around,</p> <p>to such an extent that Jesus could no longer publicly enter a city, but stayed out in unpopulated areas; and they were coming to Him from everywhere.</p>	<p>12 While He was in one of the cities, behold, <i>there was</i> a man covered with leprosy; and when he saw Jesus, he fell on his face and implored Him, saying, “Lord, if You are willing, You can make me clean.”</p> <p>13 And He stretched out His hand and touched him, saying, “I am willing; be cleansed.” And immediately the leprosy left him.</p> <p>14 And He ordered him to tell no one, “But go and show yourself to the priest and make an offering for your cleansing, just as Moses commanded, as a testimony to them.”</p> <p>15 But the news about Him was spreading even farther, and large crowds were gathering to hear <i>Him</i> and to be healed of their sicknesses.</p> <p>16 But Jesus Himself would <i>often</i> slip away to the wilderness and pray.</p>

Galilean Ministry—Jesus Forgives and Heals a Paralytic (December 30 – March 31)

Matthew 9:1–8	Mark 2:1–12	Luke 5:17–26
<p>1 Getting into a boat, Jesus crossed over <i>the sea</i> and came to His own city.</p>	<p>1 When He had come back to Capernaum several days afterward, it was heard that He was at home.</p> <p>2 And many were gathered together, so that there was no longer room, not even near the door; and He was speaking the word to them.</p>	<p>17 One day</p> <p>He was teaching; and there were <i>some</i> Pharisees and teachers of the law sitting <i>there</i>, who had come from every village of Galilee and Judea and <i>from</i> Jerusalem; and the power of the Lord was <i>present</i> for Him to perform healing.</p>

<p>2 And they brought to Him a paralytic lying on a bed.</p> <p>Seeing their faith, Jesus said to the paralytic, “Take courage, son; your sins are forgiven.”</p> <p>3 And some of the scribes said to themselves,</p> <p>“This <i>fellow</i> blasphemes.”</p> <p>4 And Jesus knowing their thoughts said,</p> <p>“Why are you thinking evil in your hearts?</p> <p>5 Which is easier, to say, ‘Your sins are forgiven,’ or to say, ‘Get up, and walk’?</p> <p>6 But so that you may know that the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins” —</p> <p>then He said to the paralytic, “Get up, pick up your bed and go home.”</p> <p>7 And he got up</p> <p>and went home.</p> <p>8 But when the crowds saw <i>this</i>, they were awestruck, and glorified God, who had given such authority to men.</p>	<p>3 And they came, bringing to Him a paralytic, carried by four men.</p> <p>4 Being unable to get to Him because of the crowd, they removed the roof above Him; and when they had dug an opening, they let down the pallet on which the paralytic was lying.</p> <p>5 And Jesus seeing their faith said to the paralytic, “Son, your sins are forgiven.”</p> <p>6 But some of the scribes were sitting there and reasoning in their hearts,</p> <p>7 “Why does this man speak that way? He is blaspheming; who can forgive sins but God alone?”</p> <p>8 Immediately Jesus, aware in His spirit that they were reasoning that way within themselves, said to them,</p> <p>“Why are you reasoning about these things in your hearts?</p> <p>9 Which is easier, to say to the paralytic, ‘Your sins are forgiven,’ or to say, ‘Get up, and pick up your pallet and walk’?</p> <p>10 But so that you may know that the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins” —</p> <p>He said to the paralytic,</p> <p>11 “I say to you, get up, pick up your pallet and go home.”</p> <p>12 And he got up and immediately picked up the pallet and went out in the sight of everyone, so that they were all amazed and were glorifying God,</p> <p>saying,</p> <p>“We have never seen anything like this.”</p>	<p>18 And <i>some men were</i> carrying on a bed a man who was paralyzed; and they were trying to bring him in and to set him down in front of Him.</p> <p>19 But not finding any <i>way</i> to bring him in because of the crowd, they went up on the roof and let him down through the tiles with his stretcher, into the middle of <i>the crowd</i>, in front of Jesus.</p> <p>20 Seeing their faith, He said,</p> <p>“Friend, your sins are forgiven you.”</p> <p>21 The scribes and the Pharisees began to reason, saying,</p> <p>“Who is this <i>man</i> who speaks blasphemies? Who can forgive sins, but God alone?”</p> <p>22 But Jesus, aware of their reasonings,</p> <p>answered and said to them,</p> <p>“Why are you reasoning in your hearts?</p> <p>23 Which is easier, to say, ‘Your sins have been forgiven you,’ or to say, ‘Get up and walk’?</p> <p>24 But, so that you may know that the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins,” —</p> <p>He said to the paralytic—</p> <p>“I say to you, get up, and pick up your stretcher and go home.”</p> <p>25 Immediately he got up before them, and picked up what he had been lying on, and went home glorifying God.</p> <p>26 They were all struck with astonishment and <i>began</i> glorifying God;</p> <p>and they were filled with fear, saying,</p> <p>“We have seen remarkable things today.”</p>
