Matthew 8:18, 23–27	Mark 4:35–41	Luke 8:22–25
<p>18 Now when Jesus saw a crowd around Him,</p> <p>He gave orders to depart to the other side of the sea.</p> <p>23 When He got into the boat, His disciples followed Him.</p> <p>24 And behold, there arose a great storm on the sea, so that the boat was being covered with the waves; but Jesus Himself was asleep.</p> <p>25 And they came to Him and woke Him, saying, “Save us, Lord; we are perishing!”</p> <p>26 He said to them, “Why are you afraid, you men of little faith?”</p> <p>Then He got up and rebuked the winds and the sea, and it became perfectly calm.</p> <p>27 The men were amazed, and said, “What kind of a man is this, that even the winds and the sea obey Him?”</p>	<p>35 On that day, when evening came, He said to them, “Let us go over to the other side.”</p> <p>36 Leaving the crowd, they took Him along with them in the boat, just as He was; and other boats were with Him.</p> <p>37 And there arose a fierce gale of wind, and the waves were breaking over the boat so much that the boat was already filling up.</p> <p>38 Jesus Himself was in the stern, asleep on the cushion; and they woke Him and said to Him, “Teacher, do You not care that we are perishing?”</p> <p>39 And He got up and rebuked the wind and said to the sea, “Hush, be still.” And the wind died down and it became perfectly calm.</p> <p>40 And He said to them, “Why are you afraid? Do you still have no faith?”</p> <p>41 They became very much afraid and said to one another, “Who then is this, that even the wind and the sea obey Him?”</p>	<p>22 Now on one of those days Jesus and His disciples got into a boat, and He said to them, “Let us go over to the other side of the lake.”</p> <p>So they launched out.</p> <p>23 But as they were sailing along He fell asleep; and a fierce gale of wind descended on the lake, and they began to be swamped and to be in danger.</p> <p>24 They came to Jesus and woke Him up, saying, “Master, Master, we are perishing!”</p> <p>And He got up and rebuked the wind and the surging waves, and they stopped, and it became calm.</p> <p>25 And He said to them, “Where is your faith?”</p> <p>They were fearful and amazed, saying to one another, “Who then is this, that He commands even the winds and the water, and they obey Him?”</p>

Galilean Ministry—The Gerasene Demoniacs (April – December 31)

<p>28 When He came to the other side into the country of the Gadarenes, two men who were demon-possessed met Him as they were coming out of the tombs.</p> <p><i>They were</i> so extremely violent that no one could pass by that way.</p>	<p>1 They came to the other side of the sea, into the country of the Gerasenes.</p> <p>2 When He got out of the boat, immediately a man from the tombs with an unclean spirit met Him,</p> <p>3 and he had his dwelling among the tombs. And no one was able to bind him anymore, even with a chain;</p> <p>4 because he had often been bound with shackles and chains, and the chains had been torn apart by him and the shackles broken in pieces, and no one was strong enough to subdue him.</p> <p>5 Constantly, night and day, he was screaming among the tombs and in the</p>	<p>26 Then they sailed to the country of the Gerasenes, which is opposite Galilee.</p> <p>27 And when He came out onto the land, He was met by a man from the city who was possessed with demons; and who had not put on any clothing for a long time, and was not living in a house, but in the tombs.</p>

And coming out, the unclean spirits entered the swine; and the herd rushed down the steep bank into the sea, about two thousand <i>of them</i>; and they were drowned in the sea.</p> <p>14 Their herdsmen</p> <p>ran away and reported it in the city and in the country.</p> <p>And <i>the people</i> came to see what it was that had happened.</p> <p>15 They came to Jesus and observed the man who had been demon-possessed sitting down, clothed and in his right mind, the very man who had had the “legion”; and they became frightened.</p> <p>16 Those who had seen it described to them how it had happened to the demon-possessed man, and <i>all</i> about the swine.</p> <p>17 And they</p> <p>began to implore Him to leave their region.</p>	<p>28 Seeing Jesus, he cried out and fell before Him, and said in a loud voice, “What business do we have with each other, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? I beg You, do not torment me.”</p> <p>29 For He had commanded the unclean spirit to come out of the man. For it had seized him many times; and he was bound with chains and shackles and kept under guard, and <i>yet</i> he would break his bonds and be driven by the demon into the desert.</p> <p>30 And Jesus asked him, “What is your name?” And he said, “Legion”; for many demons had entered him.</p> <p>31 They were imploring Him not to command them to go away into the abyss.</p> <p>32 Now there was a herd of many swine feeding there on the mountain; and <i>the demons</i> implored Him to permit them to enter the swine. And He gave them permission.</p> <p>33 And the demons came out of the man and entered the swine; and the herd rushed down the steep bank into the lake</p> <p>and was drowned.</p> <p>34 When the herdsmen saw what had happened, they ran away and reported it in the city and <i>out</i> in the country.</p> <p>35 <i>The people</i> went out to see what had happened; and they came to Jesus, and found the man from whom the demons had gone out, sitting down at the feet of Jesus, clothed and in his right mind; and they became frightened.</p> <p>36 Those who had seen it reported to them how the man who was demon-possessed had been made well.</p> <p>37 And all the people of the country of the Gerasenes and the surrounding district asked Him to leave them, for they were gripped with great fear;</p>

Galilean Ministry—Jairus’ Daughter Restored and a Woman Healed (April – December 31)

Matthew 9:18–26	Mark 5:21–43	Luke 8:40–56
<p>18 While He was saying these things to them, a <i>synagogue</i> official came and bowed down before Him, and said, "My daughter has just died; but come and lay Your hand on her, and she will live." 19 Jesus got up and <i>began</i> to follow him, and <i>so did</i> His disciples. 20 And a woman who had been suffering from a hemorrhage for twelve years, came up behind Him and touched the fringe of His cloak; 21 for she was saying to herself, "If I only touch His garment, I will get well." 22 But Jesus turning</p>	<p>21 When Jesus had crossed over again in the boat to the other side, a large crowd gathered around Him; and so He stayed by the seashore. 22 One of the synagogue officials named Jairus came up, and on seeing Him, fell at His feet 23 and implored Him earnestly, saying, "My little daughter is at the point of death; <i>please</i> come and lay Your hands on her, so that she will get well and live." 24 And He went off with him; and a large crowd was following Him and pressing in on Him. 25 A woman who had had a hemorrhage for twelve years, 26 and had endured much at the hands of many physicians, and had spent all that she had and was not helped at all, but rather had grown worse— 27 after hearing about Jesus, she came up in the crowd behind <i>Him</i> and touched His cloak. 28 For she thought, "If I just touch His garments, I will get well." 29 Immediately the flow of her blood was dried up; and she felt in her body that she was healed of her affliction. 30 Immediately Jesus, perceiving in Himself that the power <i>proceeding</i> from Him had gone forth, turned around in the crowd and said, "Who touched My garments?" 31 And His disciples said to Him,</p>	<p>40 And as Jesus returned, the people welcomed Him, for they had all been waiting for Him. 41 And there came a man named Jairus, and he was an official of the synagogue; and he fell at Jesus’ feet, and <i>began</i> to implore Him to come to his house; 42 for he had an only daughter, about twelve years old, and she was dying. But as He went, the crowds were pressing against Him. 43 And a woman who had a hemorrhage for twelve years, and could not be healed by anyone, 44 came up behind Him and touched the fringe of His cloak, and immediately her hemorrhage stopped. 45 And Jesus said, "Who is the one who touched Me?" <p>and seeing her said, “Daughter, take courage; your faith has made you well.”</p> <p>At once the woman was made well.</p> <p>23 When Jesus came into the official’s house, and saw the flute-players and the crowd in noisy disorder, 24 He said, “Leave; for the girl has not died, but is asleep.” And they <i>began</i> laughing at Him.</p> <p>25 But when the crowd had been sent out,</p> <p>He entered and took her by the hand,</p> <p>and the girl got up.</p>	<p>“You see the crowd pressing in on You, and You say, ‘Who touched Me?’”</p> <p>32 And He looked around to see the woman who had done this. 33 But the woman fearing and trembling, aware of what had happened to her, came and fell down before Him and told Him the whole truth.</p> <p>34 And He said to her, “Daughter, your faith has made you well; go in peace and be healed of your affliction.”</p> <p>35 While He was still speaking, they came from the <i>house of</i> the synagogue official, saying, “Your daughter has died; why trouble the Teacher anymore?” 36 But Jesus, overhearing what was being spoken, said to the synagogue official, “Do not be afraid <i>any longer</i>, only believe.” 37 And He allowed no one to accompany Him, except Peter and James and John the brother of James.</p> <p>38 They came to the house of the synagogue official; and He saw a commotion, and <i>people</i> loudly weeping and wailing. 39 And entering in, He said to them, “Why make a commotion and weep? The child has not died, but is asleep.” 40 They <i>began</i> laughing at Him.</p> <p>But putting them all out, He took along the child’s father and mother and His own companions, and entered <i>the room</i> where the child was. 41 Taking the child by the hand, He said to her, “Talitha kum!” (which translated means, “Little girl, I say to you, get up!”).</p> <p>42 Immediately the girl got up and <i>began</i> to walk, for she was twelve years old. And immediately they were completely astounded. 43b and He said that <i>something</i> should be given her to eat. 43a And He gave them strict orders</p>	<p>“Master, the people are crowding and pressing in on You.” 46 But Jesus said, “Someone did touch Me, for I was aware that power had gone out of Me.”</p> <p>47 When the woman saw that she had not escaped notice, she came trembling and fell down before Him, and declared in the presence of all the people the reason why she had touched Him, and how she had been immediately healed. 48 And He said to her, “Daughter, your faith has made you well; go in peace.”</p> <p>49 While He was still speaking, someone came from <i>the house of</i> the synagogue official, saying, “Your daughter has died; do not trouble the Teacher anymore.” 50 But when Jesus heard <i>this</i>, He answered him, “Do not be afraid <i>any longer</i>; only believe, and she will be made well.” 51 When He came to the house, He did not allow anyone to enter with Him, except Peter and John and James, and the girl’s father and mother. 52 Now they were all weeping and lamenting for her; but He said, “Stop weeping, for she has not died, but is asleep.” 53 And they <i>began</i> laughing at Him, knowing that she had died.</p> <p>54 He, however, took her by the hand and called, saying, “Child, arise!”</p> <p>55a And her spirit returned, and she got up immediately;</p> <p>56a Her parents were amazed; 55b and He gave orders for <i>something</i> to be given her to eat. 56b but He instructed them</p>

Galilean Ministry—Healing the Blind and Driving Out a Demon (April – December 31)

Matthew 9:27–34

27 As Jesus went on from there, two blind men followed Him, crying out, "Have mercy on us, Son of David!"

28 When He entered the house, the blind men came up to Him, and Jesus said to them, "Do you believe that I am able to do this?" They said to Him, "Yes, Lord."

29 Then He touched their eyes, saying, "It shall be done to you according to your faith."

30 And their eyes were opened. And Jesus sternly warned them: "See that no one knows *about this!*"

31 But they went out and spread the news about Him throughout all that land.

32 As they were going out, a mute, demon-possessed man was brought to Him.

33 After the demon was cast out, the mute man spoke; and the crowds were amazed, *and were saying*, "Nothing like this has ever been seen in Israel."

34 But the Pharisees were saying, "He casts out the demons by the ruler of the demons."
