June 4 Answers

1) God's approval of Solomon's temple and his dedicatory prayer. When Solomon finished praying (1 Kgs 8:56–61), God sent <u>fire</u> down from heaven and consumed the burnt offering and sacrifices, and His <u>glory</u> filled the temple. The people bowed down with their faces to the ground and worshipped and gave praise to God. This teaches us that <u>humility</u> is the appropriate response when we are in God's presence, and that praise is proclaiming the <u>truth</u> about God's character (2 Chr 7:3). Solomon and the people celebrated a dedication festival and observed the Feast of <u>Tabernacles</u>. When it was over, they went home joyful and glad of heart. This shows us that worshipping God is a <u>blessing</u>, and that He is delighted when we find our <u>happiness</u> and satisfaction in Him. Solomon spent the next thirteen years building his palace. When he was finished, God appeared to him a <u>second</u> time and told him that He had heard his prayer and would grant his request. But God also warned Solomon that disobedience would bring disaster: <u>exile</u> from the land and destruction of the <u>temple</u>. This teaches us that we have the power to bring blessing or ruin on those under our authority. We have a solemn obligation to walk before God in integrity and uprightness of heart (1 Kgs 9:4).
