1) God continued by urging the people to remember who they had <u>cast</u> aside (Lam 3:21–22). Next, God told them to accept the punishment of their sin without <u>complaint</u> (Lam 3:39). Instead, they should patiently bear the yoke of His <u>discipline</u> (Lam 3:28–29). Next, God told them to <u>repent</u> of their sin and turn back to Him (Lam 3:40, 49–50). They had much to be sorry for—they had "transgressed and rebelled" (Lam 3:42)—and godly sorrow always leads to <u>repentance</u> (2 Cor 7:10). God also told them to leave <u>vengeance</u> in His capable hands (Lam 3:64). God had used the Babylonians to punish Judah, but they would be held <u>accountable</u> for what they had done, for they were a wicked and idolatrous nation.
