1) The birth of John the Baptist and the conception of Jesus. Over <u>420</u> years had passed since Nehemiah rebuked the remnant and called them back to covenant faithfulness. In the intervening years, the prophecies made by <u>Daniel</u> had come to pass. Eventually, the <u>Roman</u> empire took control of Judea, and there was a long period of peace. It was during this time that the angel Gabriel announced the birth of John and Jesus. Note the reference to the <u>righteousness</u> of Zechariah and Elizabeth. Their lives testify to the fact that people could walk "<u>blamelessly</u> in all the commandments and statutes of the Lord" (Luke 1:6). They manifested the combination of outward compliance and inward obedience that God always wanted from His people, and they show us that we too can live a life of holiness. The preface to John's gospel teaches us so many important truths about Jesus: (1) Jesus is the <u>Son</u>, the eternal "only begotten" of the Father, (2) Jesus is the <u>Word</u>, the personification of the Father's self-expression in creation and revelation, (3) Jesus is the God-man, fully God and fully man, a union of two <u>natures</u> in one <u>Person</u>, (4) Jesus is the <u>Life</u>, the source of spiritual life for all who believe, (5) Jesus is the <u>Light</u>, the shining beacon of hope in a world of darkness, and (6) Jesus is the <u>Exegete</u>, the revealer and explainer of the Father.
