1) Jesus had a <a hreating healing and exorcism ministry in the region of Galilee. This fulfilled the prophecy of Isaiah: "He took our Illnesses and bore our <a href="diseases" (Matt 8:17; Isa 53:4a). This teaches us that certain aspects of Jesus' earthly ministry were unique to his role as the Servant spoken of by Isaiah (Isa 42:1–4; 49:1–6; 50:4–9; 52:13–53:12). As Jesus' disciples, we're not called to duplicate Jesus' ministry. Instead, we're called to follow the leadership of the Holy Spirit and do the work God has for us to do. In the middle of a successful ministry in Capernaum, Jesus left early in the morning, while it was still dark, and went away to a secluded place where he could pray (Mark 1:35). He did this regularly (Luke 5:16), and his example is something we should follow. As disciples, it's imperative that we listen to God's Word each day and respond to what He has said. This is how to have a vibrant, healthy relationship with God.
