- 1) Paul's farewell speech to the Ephesian elders has much to teach us about spiritual <u>leadership</u>. When the elders came, Paul could have said, 'Now be sure to remember all the things I taught you.' Instead, he reminded them of how he had <u>lived</u> among them (Acts 20:18). This teaches us that the essence of leadership is setting the right <u>example</u> for others.
 - Paul served God with **humility**.
 - Paul faithfully **endured** persecution.
 - Paul boldly <u>declared</u> "anything that was profitable" (Acts 20:20).
 - Paul shared the gospel with both <u>Jews</u> and <u>Gentiles</u>.
 - Paul followed the leadership of the **Spirit**.
 - Paul refused to be **swayed** by the prevailing doctrinal winds of his day.
 - Paul warned his congregation of the danger of **false** teachers.
 - Paul did not **covet** material possessions.
 - Paul worked hard to supply his own needs.
