1) Paul's letter to Philemon is a good example of how to <u>resolve</u> conflict between Christians. First, Paul brought the disputing parties together by addressing them as <u>family</u>. Second, Paul was courteous and <u>tactful</u>, and his wording allowed both parties to save <u>face</u> in an awkward and difficult situation. Third, rather than giving a command, Paul <u>appealed</u> to Philemon to do the right thing. Fourth, Paul treated Philemon as an equal <u>partner</u> in ministry, even though as an apostle, he was Philemon's spiritual superior. In all, this letter shows us how to exercise spiritual authority and leadership in a <u>kind</u> and loving way. Jude's letter shows how concerned he was about the reports of false <u>teachers</u>, and he wanted to encourage his fellow believers to "<u>contend</u> for the faith" (Jude 1:3). Our responsibility is threefold: (1) to <u>build</u> ourselves up in the faith, <u>pray</u> in the Spirit, and keep ourselves in God's love (Jude 1:20–21); (2) to identify and <u>expose</u> those who have "crept in unnoticed" (Jude 1:4); (3) to <u>save</u> those who have been seduced by false doctrine, acting in a spirit of mercy, but also with <u>fear</u>, knowing the danger of such teachings (Jude 1:22–23).
