

## March 16 Questions

- 1) Moses' Second Sermon (Part 1c). Moses warned the people not to interpret their victory in the coming conquest as a sign of their own \_\_\_\_\_: "God is not giving you this good land to possess because of your righteousness, for you are a \_\_\_\_\_ people" (Deut 9:6). This teaches us the danger of \_\_\_\_\_. Rather than viewing success as proof of our own goodness and virtue, we need to recognize it as the unmerited \_\_\_\_\_ of God's mercy and grace. Anytime we become smug or puffed up over our achievements, we need to remind ourselves of the many times we've \_\_\_\_\_ against God.
