- 1) David's psalms. Psalm 16 is the prayer of a man who took _____ in God. He loved the _____ and rejected those who ran after other gods. He trusted in God, and he claimed the LORD as his " _____ " (Ps 16:5-6). He said, "I have set the LORD always before me; because he is at my right hand, I shall not be shaken. Therefore my heart is glad, and my whole being rejoices; my flesh also dwells secure. For you will not abandon my soul to _____, or let your holy one see _____. You make known to me the path of _____; in your presence there is fullness of joy; at your right hand are pleasures forevermore" (Ps 16:8-11). _____ later told the Jews that David was *not* speaking of himself in this psalm; he was speaking prophetically of _____ (Acts 2:25-31). God did not allow His Son to "see corruption," but _____ Him up from the dead and _____ Him at His right hand. "Let all the house of Israel therefore know for certain that God has made him both _____ and _____, this Jesus whom you crucified" (Acts 2:36).
