- 1) Elisha anointed Jehu king of Israel. God said, “I will _____ the blood of my servants the prophets and the blood of all the Lord’s servants shed by Jezebel” (2 Kgs 9:7b). This teaches us that no one can lay a hand on one of God’s servants and get _____ with it. God allows the wicked to make their own choices, but He also makes sure that _____ is done in the end (cf. Luke 18:7–8). Jehu was only too eager to carry out God’s desire for vengeance against Ahab’s house.
