- 1) In the “Book of Comfort,” Isaiah revealed that God would redeem Israel from their future \_\_\_\_\_ captivity by using his servant, \_\_\_\_\_ the Great. In chapters 49–55, Isaiah revealed that God would redeem Israel from a far greater captivity: the bondage of \_\_\_\_\_.
