1) If there was ever a man who didn't deserve forgiveness, it was Manasseh. He \_\_\_\_\_\_\_ his own children in the fires of idolatry, and he \_\_\_\_\_\_\_ so many innocent people that Jerusalem was filled with blood from one end to the other. And yet, "when he was in distress, he entreated the favor of the LORD his God and \_\_\_\_\_\_\_ himself greatly before the God of his fathers" (2 Chr 33:12).
