- 1) The first half of the story of Esther teaches us several lessons. First, it shows us that God has a \_\_\_\_\_ for our lives. God's plan for Esther was that she change the \_\_\_\_\_ of Ahasuerus toward the Jews. God's plan for us is that we change the minds of the \_\_\_\_\_ toward Jesus Christ. Esther played a pivotal role in the salvation of the Jews, and as disciples of Jesus, we play an important part in God's plan to \_\_\_\_\_ the world. Esther had grown up being obedient to her cousin, and this godly \_\_\_\_\_ enabled her to submit to his leadership when it really mattered. This teaches us how vital it is to obey the authorities in our lives, for if we will not submit to those we can \_\_\_\_\_, how can we submit to God? (cf. 1 John 4:20).
