	of all creation" (Col 1:15). We usually associate the term firstborn with birth, as in
	the first child born (cf. Luke 2:7), but it can also denote priority in or supremacy in

	authority. Paul was saying that Jesus is the first created being, but rather that Jesus is
	supreme over all things as Creator, for "all things were created him and for him" (Col
